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1 Safety information

- Securely place the printer on a stable surface.
- Keep the ventilation inlets and outlets of the braille printer free.
- Connect the braille printer to a grounded power outlet only.
- **Warning:** This is a class A product. In a domestic environment this product may cause radio-interference in which case the user may be required to take adequate measures.
- **Warning:** The user is recommended to use ear protection or an Acoustic Hood to reduce the sound pressure. Long-time exposure without protection can lead to hearing loss.

1.1 Approvals

Speech feedback refers to the echo in the printer.

2.1 Backlit text on all models

Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, Network: Flicker when available, and light up when connected.

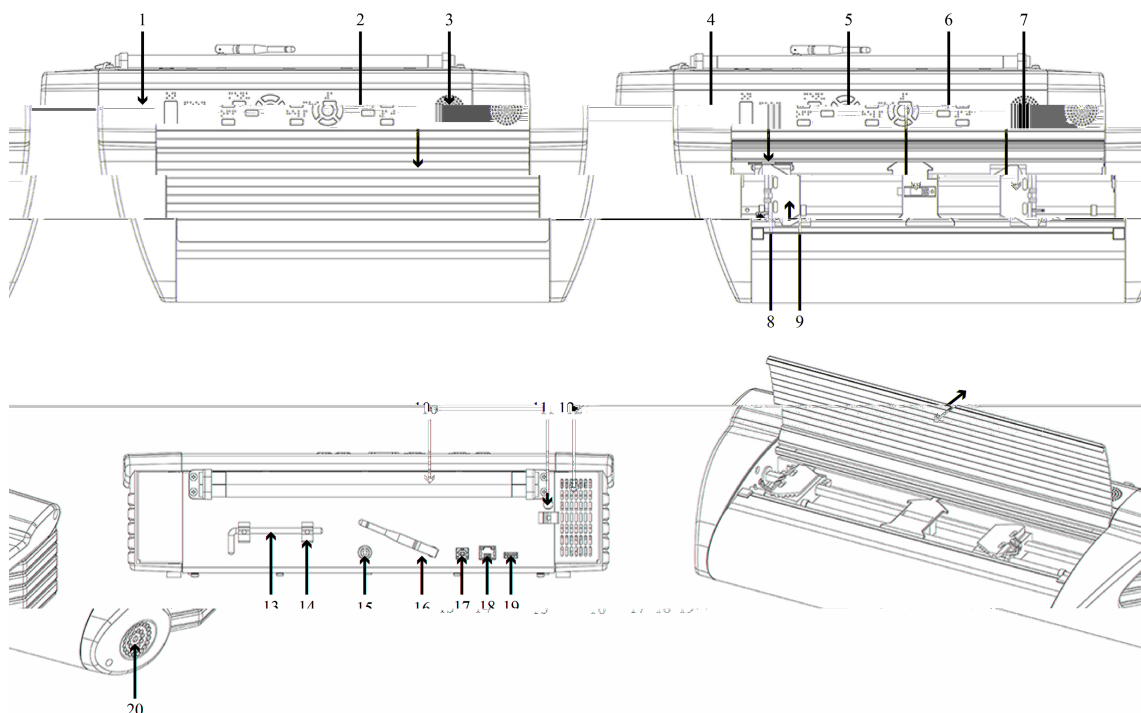
idB: Flicker during translation, and light up during printing with idB.

UPDATE: Require a network connection. Activated when the printer is connected to a network with internet access. It lights up when an update is available and flickers during a firmware upgrade.

PAPER JAM: Light up when there is a paper jam.

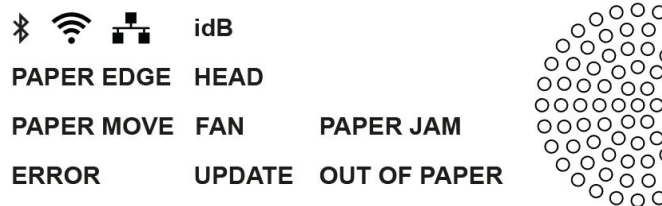
ERROR: Light up when there is an error. Press HELP for more information.

PAPER MOVE: Flicker when paper is moving.

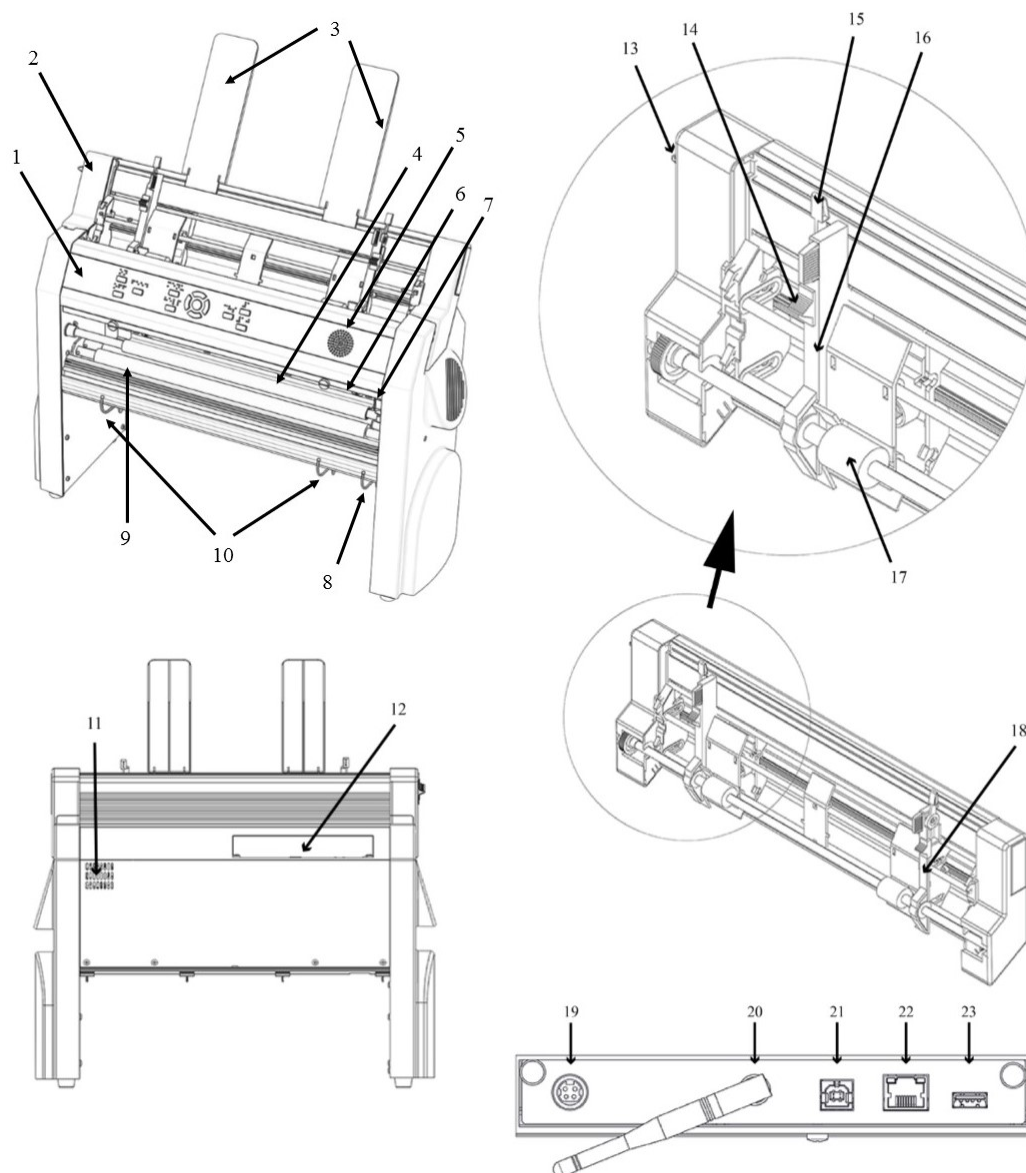
PAPER EDGE: Light up when paper is in front of the paper edge sensor.

HEAD: Light up when the print head is in the home position.

FAN: Light up when the fan is on.

OUT OF PAPER: Light up when there is no paper in the paper tractor.

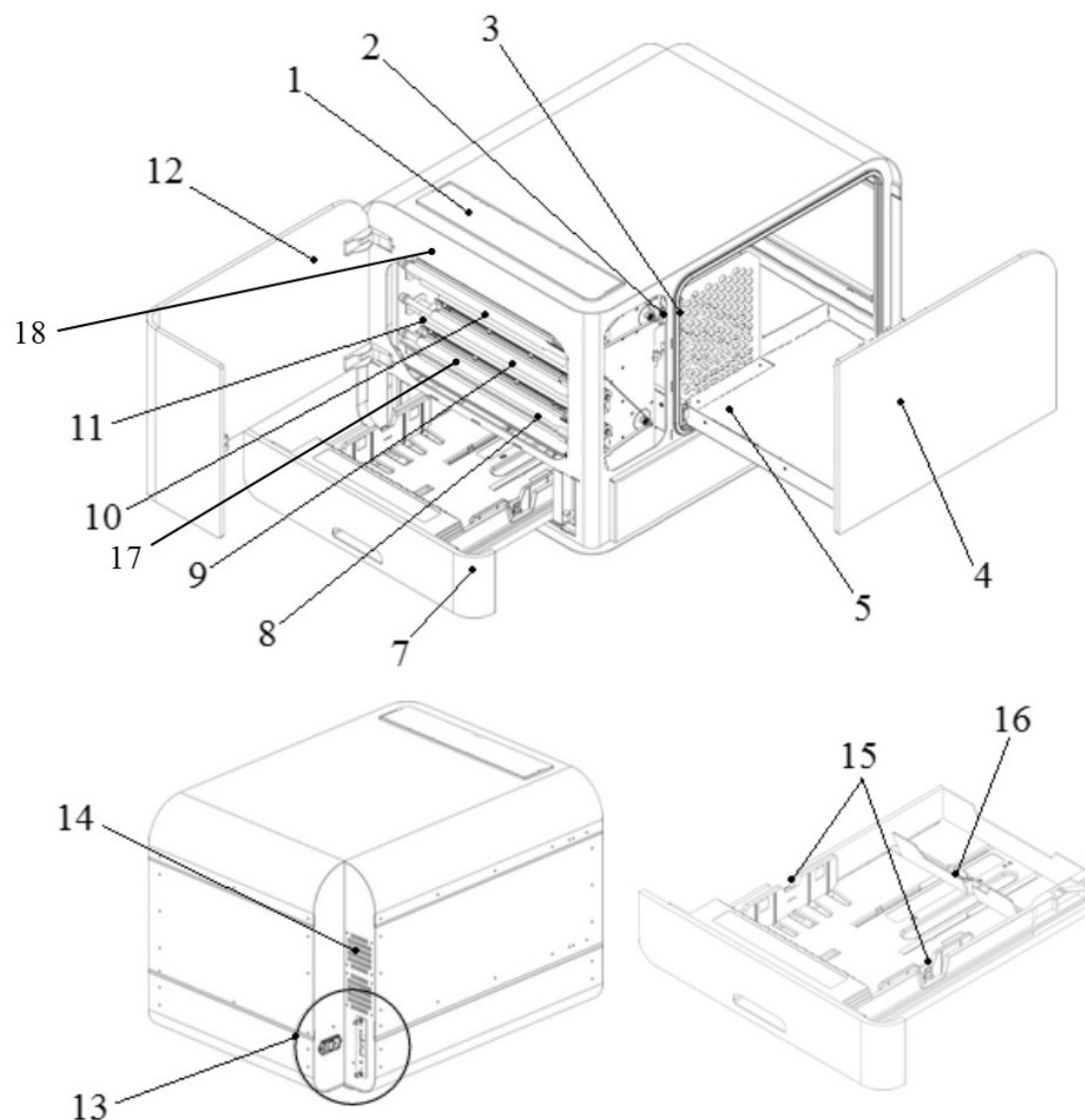

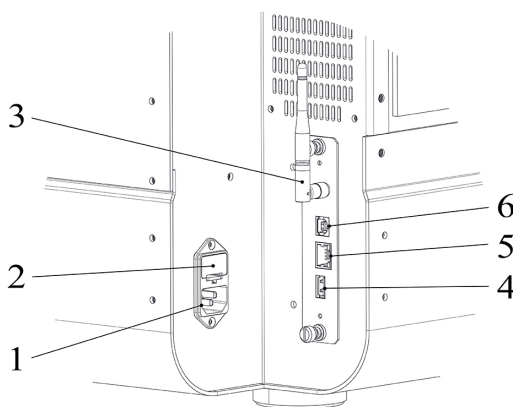

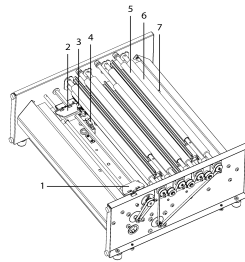

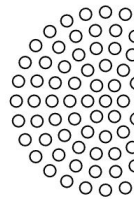

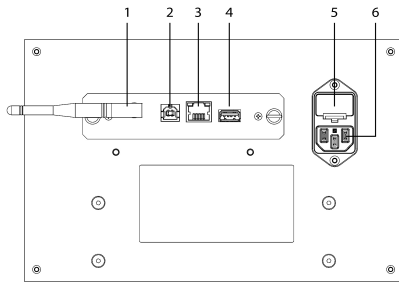

2.5.3 Wheel montage FanFold

1. Remove the upper packing material.
2. Rotate the FanFold so the first corner is outside of the bottom packing material. Montage the first wheel with with the bolts from bottom. The bolts and wrench are included inside the printer.
3. Repeat step 2 for wheel two and three.
4. Move the bottom packing material outside of the FanFold-D except one corner supporting close to the position of last wheel. Montage the last wheel and remove the bottom packing material.

3 Installation

3.1 Getting started

3.1.1 Unpacking of the printer

Unpack the printer gently and check all items. **Keep the packing material and transport locks.** The two (2) year warranty on parts remains valid only if the printer is transported in original packaging, and the transport locks are properly in place.

The following items are included in shipment:

- Braille printer
- User manual
- Index USB memory stick
- Power cord

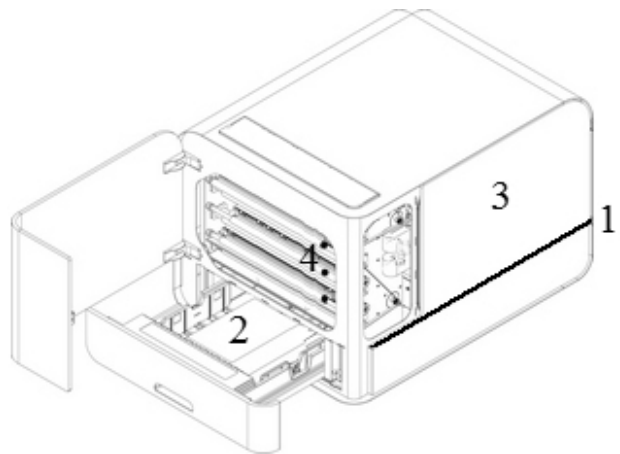
- USB cord
- External power supply for Basic-D and Everest-D.
- Transport locks

Basic-D, Everest-D and BrailleBox

- Power on the printer without connecting the USB cord.
- The 'Wizard to remove transport locking' will start automatically.
- Follow the wizard steps. When completed, the printer will restart and is ready to be used.

BrailleBox picture

1. Rubber seal
2. Accessories kit box
3. Braille tray glass
4. Print head transport locks



BrailleBox

1. Open the paper tray. Remove the accessories kit box from the paper tray. Turn on the printer.
2. The wizard will start.
3. Follow the wizard steps.

3.1.2 Speech feedback

The speech feedback is set to English (factory delivery).

In April 2017 the following languages are available:

Arabic, Dutch, English (Indian), English (UK), English (US), Finnish, French, German, Italian, Korean, Mandarin, Norwegian, Portuguese (Brazil), Portuguese (Portugal), Russian, Spanish (Colombia), Spanish (Mexico), Swedish and Turkish.

3.1.3 Firmware upgrade

Index printer can be upgraded to latest firmware free of charge. It is highly recommended to upgrade the firmware when installing a new Index V5 printer. The upgrade includes bug fixes and new or improved functionality. Please find detailed information on www.indexbraille.com

Upgrade via Internet connection

When the V5 printer is connected to internet, it checks for an update automatically. The UPDATE text lights up indicates that new update is available.

Start upgrade by selecting:

MENU / User service / Firmware upgrade / Firmware upgrade from internet / OK to start.

Upgrade via USB memory stick

- Download the latest V5 firmware on [Index Braille Support / Download V5 firmware](#). File name example: **Embosser-update-2016-12-15.zip**.
- Save the V5 firmware file to a USB memory stick.
- Insert the USB memory stick into the V5 printer.
- Start the upgrade by pressing:
MENU / User service / Firmware upgrade / Firmware upgrade from USB memory stick / OK to start.

The UPDATE text lights up during the upgrade process. The speech feedback is activated. **Do not power off the printer during an upgrade**. The upgrade process may take 5-15 minutes and is completed when the printer restarts automatically.

3.2 Index Braille Printer Driver

Index software and printer drivers for Index Braille printers may be installed from the USB memory stick, included in the shipment or by downloading them from www.indexbraille.com.

3.2.1 Install to USB port

All Index printers require the Index Braille Printer Driver to function properly on a USB port. **Install the Index Braille printer driver in your computer before connecting the printer to the USB device port.**

To find the current version of the Index Braille printer driver for your printer, access the control panel in your computer by selecting:

- Control Panel / Uninstall a program / Index Braille Driver.
- The current version number is shown on the right hand column, listed under versions.

Windows

To install Index printer driver 8.x or higher, suitable for Windows XP, Vista, Win 7, Win 8, Win 10, follow these steps:

1. Close all applications on your PC.
2. Download [Index Printer Driver 8.x or higher](#).
3. Right click the driver installation file and select "Run as administrator" and follow the installation wizard.
4. Connect the supplied USB cord.
5. Turn on the printer.
6. For Windows Vista and later versions, the Plug & Play Found new hardware wizard will complete the USB installation.

3.2.2 Network connection

The Wi-Fi and wired network icons (blue), light up when a wired network or Wi-Fi is connected. During network search, the network icon flickers.

Get the network IP address by pressing:

- HELP + 10 Speech feedback IP address.
- HELP + 1 Print in letter graphics and braille.

Once the Wi-Fi or wired network has been connected, the printer will remember the network name (SSID) and password.

Connect Wi-Fi network

- When a known network is available, the Wi-Fi icon flickers during the network search.

Speech feedback: "Wi-Fi network connected. IP number XXX, SSID name".

- When no known network is available, the Wi-Fi icon light is off.

Speech feedback: "No known network available".

3.2.2.1 Wired IP network setup

In Index V5 January 2017 Firmware and higher, **Wi-Fi network is enabled by default.**

First step to connect to a wired network

Plug in the network cord to a Local Area Network (LAN) with DHCP support.

- The wired network icon flickers when establishing a network connection.
- The network icon lights up when the network is connected to the internet.
- **HELP+10** The printer speech feedback: "Wired network ###.###.#.##", e.g. IP address: 192.168.4.14.

HELP+1 Print "Network information page" including IP address

3.2.2.2 Wizard for static IP address

MENU / Communication / Wizard for wired network / OK.

Detailed information in this knowledge base link.

3.2.2.3 Wi-Fi network setup

There are alternative ways to setup Wi-Fi network IP connection:

- Set up IP with the Web-App (Recommended)
- Set up IP with Wi-Fi setup file
- Set up with WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup - WPS button on the router)
- Set up Wi-Fi network from control panel

3.2.2.4 Reservation of IP address on DHCP

The best way to reserve a permanent IP address to a specific Index printer is via reservation of the MAC address of the printer to a specific IP address on the router.

This is typically a task for the Network Administrator. For detailed information,

search on the internet for "Reservation of IP address on DHCP + (Your router name)".

3.3 Printing braille

Index-direct-Braille (idB) is a direct printing application in Index V5 to print standard documents (Word type) in braille without using a traditional braille editor.

IdB Characteristics:

- Translates and formats the braille printout following the settings in the **active layout**.
- Text-to-braille translation in literary or contracted braille (more than 140 languages)
- Formats the text into braille page size (lines/page, character/line, margins, braille page number, volume page number)
- Latest idB functions are automatically installed when upgrading the V5 embosser firmware
- IdB supports unlimited number of users in the local network.
- IdB is free of charge.

For braille mathematics, music, tactile graphics, complex documents and proof reading functions, a separate braille editor is required.

3.3.1 Index-direct-Braille (idB)

idB supports:

- Braille in grade 0 (computer), 1 (literary), and 2 (contracted)
- Word XML (.docx) files
- Word (.doc) files
- PDF (.pdf) files
- Text (.txt) files
- Page numbering
- Volume handling (for braille books)
- Index V4 and V5 braille printers

idB uses the Liblouis open source braille translation system, which supports the majority of languages worldwide.

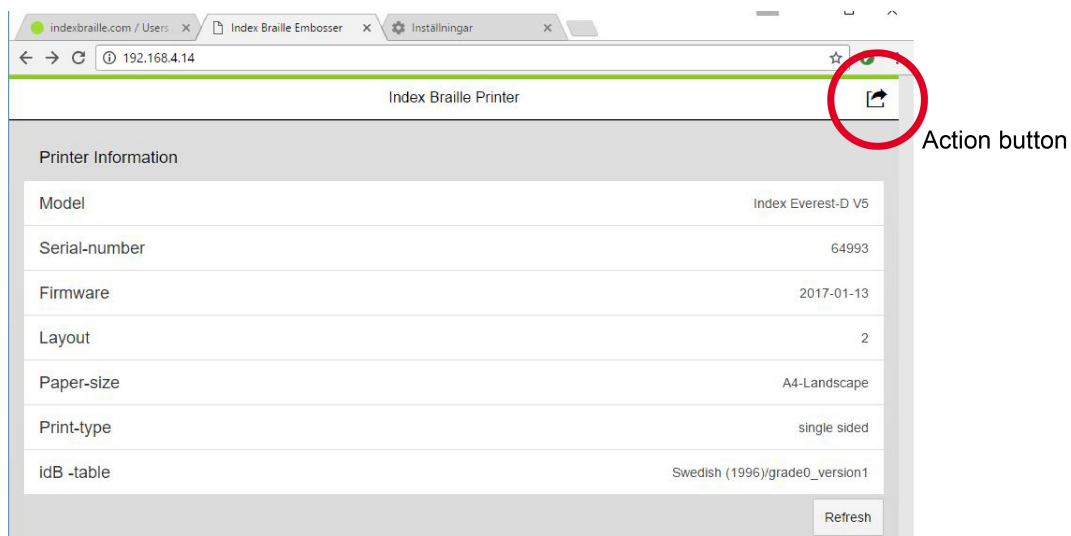

3.3.1.1 Printing with the Web App

1. In order to get your printer IP address, press HELP + 10. Speech feedback: "IP number", e.g. "IP 192.168.4.14".
2. Start the web app by opening a search window on your browser. Make sure your device is connected to the same network as the V5 printer.
3. Type your printer IP number on the browser.
4. After a few seconds the web app interface will appear on your device. Please see below picture.



Web interface

Start the web app function by pressing the action button that provides menu options below:

- Print

Print standard files (.doc, docx, .pdf, .txt, .rtf) for idB translation/formatting or braille-ready files (.brl, .brf).

Browse your file, preview function for formatted braille text in braille or text font.

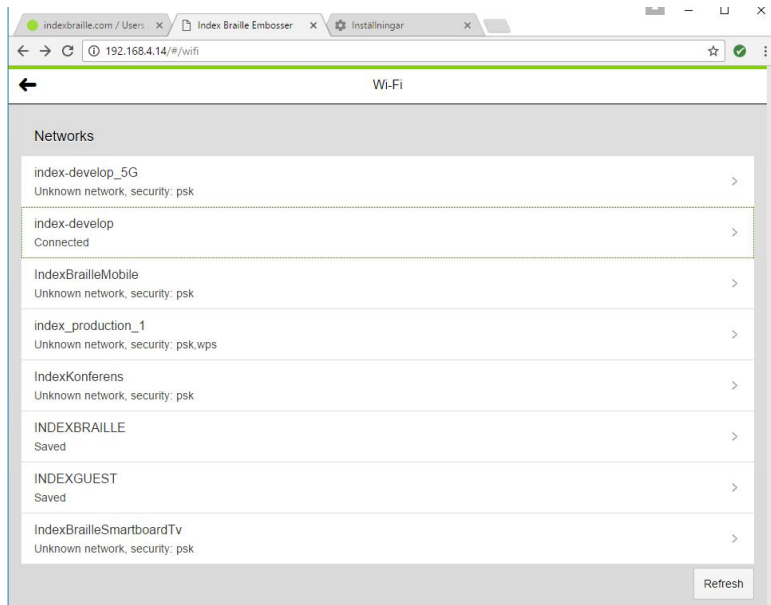
Upload the file.

- Wi-Fi

Available network is shown. The network on the top position is the network that has already been connected and has a strong signal.

Functions: Select, Connect, Forget, Insert password for new network, and Start WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup).

3.3.1.2 Printing from USB Memory stick

- Index V5 printer.
- A USB memory stick.
- Standard text file (docx, doc, pdf, rtf, txt) using idB text-to-braille to translate and format the braille page.
- Braille files (.brl, .brf), already translated to braille is printed without idB translation and formatting.

Steps for printing

- Set up the active layout, including page size, braille layout, page numbering, and braille translation language/grade (idB) to your preferences.
- Press the MENU key on the printer.
- Select Print / Print from USB memory stick.
- Find the file by using the arrow keys. The speech feedback will guide you to navigate the USB file structure.
- Press OK to print the selected file.
- On the printer control panel, the idB icon will flash during the translation and formatting process, normally a few seconds.
- During the idB braille printing process, the idB icon lights up.

3.3.1.3 Emboss with idB in Windows

- Save and then close the file in Word as .doc, .docx, .txt or PDF format.
- Right click on the file from the list, and then select Index-direct-Braille.
- Select your printer model and click OK.
- The file will now be transmitted to the selected Index printer.
- The flashing idB icon indicates ongoing text-to-braille translation process.
- Embossing of the braille document will start. The light-up idB icon indicates the idB use for the document.

3.3.1.4 Emboss with idB in Mac

- Open the document in your preferred editor/viewer program (Preview OS X).
- Go to file. Select Print and select an installed Index printer.
- The file will now be transmitted to the selected Index printer.
- The flashing idB icon indicates ongoing text-to-braille translation process.
- Embossing of the braille document will start. The light-up idB icon indicates the use of idB for the document.

3.3.1.5 Emboss with idB in Linux

- Open the document in your preferred editor/viewer.
- Go to file. Select Print and then select an installed Index printer. Press OK.
- The file will now be transmitted to the selected Index printer.
- The flashing idB icon indicates ongoing text-to-braille translation process.

- Embossing of the braille document will start. The light-up idB icon indicates the use of idB for the document.

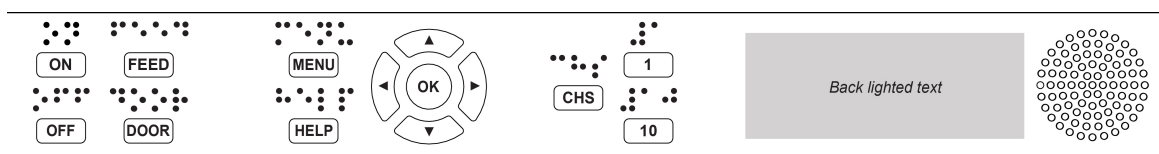
3.3.2 External braille editor

4 Control panel



4.1 Menu summary

4.1.1 V5 menu

- **ON**
 - Flickering ON: Ongoing startup process.
 - Light-up ON: The printer is on.
- **MENU** - Open MENU function.
 - Light-up MENU on display: MENU is open. Use the arrow keys to move within the MENU option and wizards.
- **OK**: Select or start a function.
- When a function is completed, the printer goes into idle mode.
- After 2 minutes on MENU mode, without any keystrokes, the printer will cancel changes automatically without saving and then go into idle mode.
- **HELP**: Provide speech feedback information about the current state of the printer.
 - Light-up HELP on display: Indicate if important information is available.

When it represents another value, it is presented by speech feedback.

4.1.3 Multiple layouts to customize

Index V5 printers are installed with 1-9 user-defined adjustable layouts.

Active layout

The active layout is the current one in use. All changes to the layout settings are made in the active layout. The layout includes paper size, braille page setup, page number position, idB text-to-braille translation and grade, literary or contracted.

Select active layout

1. When the printer is on idle mode, press arrow up/down to go to the preferred layout. Then press OK to select it as the active layout. This is the same function as in Index V4 printers.
2. Alternatively, you can select an active layout in the menu structure by pressing:
MENU / Braille layout / Select active layout / Go to the layout you want to select as active, and then press OK.

Default distributor layout

Set up the printer to a specific distributor (region) layout by pressing:

MENU / Braille layout / Restore layout / Restore distributor default layout / Select distributor country, company name and press OK.

A default distributor layout includes:

- Number of layouts.
- All information specified in each layout wizard. The most significant information consists of
 - Paper size.
 - Print type, single/double-sided page, booklet, etc.
 - Text-to-braille translation when using idB.
 - Braille page layout, lines per page, characters per line, and margins.
 - Braille page number and position.




4.2 Wizards

Wizards are used to guide users through setup, calibration, and adjustment etc. All wizards follow the same user interface structure.

- Start a wizard by pressing MENU option. Press OK.
- Follow the wizard by pressing the right arrow key.
- If required to go back to the wizard, press the left arrow key. This will take you back to the previous step.
- If required to edit a value in the wizard, press:
OK to edit, Arrow up/down to select and OK again to save.
The speech feedback will provide further instructions.
- Press OK to start the automatic wizard process.
- Completed wizard is verified by the speech feedback: "Wizard completed. Press OK to save".
